



PETER LAUNCHES FOOTPATH CAMPAIGN

Danger after dark...

PETER has launched a campaign to make the footpaths safer near TESCO supermarket.

Worried local residents say that overgrown trees and no street lighting have made one path a real danger spot after dark. There have been several muggings, one at knifepoint.

PETER is pressing for the trees to be cut back and for at least one street light to be installed. But Council officials told residents that the trees can't be cut back yet because of nesting birds.

...and fences to mend

Other danger spots are right by the bridges over the brook. Sections of fencing next to the bridge railings are missing. It's feared schoolchildren are at risk of falling if they're tempted to climb through the gap.

Council officials have told **PETER** no money is available at the moment to put these problems right. But City planners have told TESCO that their expansion plans are conditional on the firm contributing to the improvement and maintenance of all the nearby footpaths.

PETER said "I welcome the hope of money from TESCO in the future. But we need repairs and improvements **NOW!** There are real dangers here - we can't wait."



PETER BACKS "PROSECUTE THEM!" PLEA

PETER is calling on City officials to prosecute Brislington Retail Park and put an end to the early morning racket of big bins being collected.



HUNGERFORD CRESCENT residents complain they are regularly woken at 7am by lorries handling the large BIFFA bins near the rear of their homes despite promises that the early morning collections would stop.

When the retail park was first set up the Council said there should be **NO** early morning rubbish collections. **PETER** said "Residents are at the end of their tether. They want the law enforced so they can have peaceful mornings and I support them fully."

City says "No!" to Nobby's

City planners have **REFUSED** plans to build flats behind Nobby's Takeaway on **WEST TOWN LANE** (Focus Issue 156).

PETER, JACKIE and several local residents had all objected. The plans were turned down because of traffic, parking and and too high a density of development.
