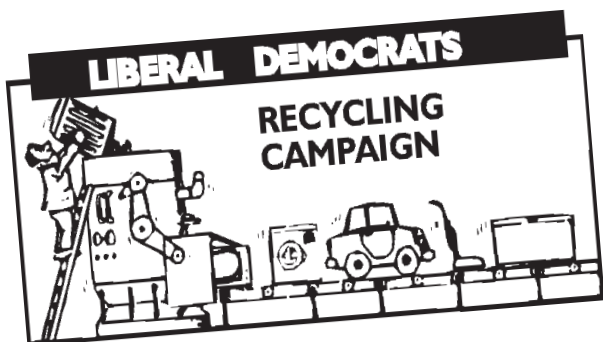
PETER said "I am proud to have had the privilege of serving Brislington West since 1997.

Recycling - Bristol leads the way!



Before Lib Dems took over last May, Bristol City Council's recycling record was at rock bottom. Over 87% of our rubbish ended up in damaging and expensive landfill.

New measures have boosted recycling to over 20% and saved £700,000 disposal costs in 2005/2006. Further down the line, the City will save millions in environmental fines.

LIDL - latest news

Detailed plans, showing the new roundabout and roads layout near the proposed Lidl store, are now virtually complete. PETER is demanding that the plans be put on public display.

Subject to the highways works being completed, the new store should open by March 2007.

More plastic recycling banks continue to be rolled out. We now have 30 across the City, including our local TESCO and SAINSBURY'S. More are planned.

Now new plans have been agreed that will nearly double our recycling rate again. Later this year new weekly collections will start, including kitchen waste, cardboard and optional garden waste.

CITY CRACKS DOWN ON EARLY MORNING BINS RACKET...

Now City officers have written to the site owners threatening enforcement action if the early collections are not stopped immediately.

...AND NEW HOPE AS FOOTPATHS CAMPAIGN WINS SUPPORT

PETER'S campaign calling for radical security and safety improvements to the footpaths near **TESCO** (FOCUS Issue 157) has won backing from local residents.

The latest news is that £78,000 will become available if plans for the **TESCO** expansion are approved at the end of May.. Along with money from the new hospital development, the grand total of cash for footpaths could be around £100,000.

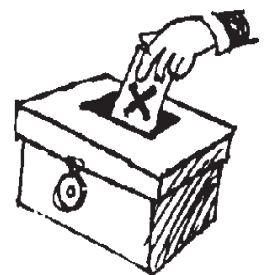
